

Earlewood – Tuesday Singles League

Date: Handicaps Established: August 11 - September 22
Divisional Championship: September 29
Handicap Play: October 6 – October 27

When: Registration starts at 5:30 – Play starts at 6:00

Bag Tags (August 11 – October 27)

Bag Tags will be done the entire 11-week period and will be issued after a player's 1st round. Cost is \$3.00 per player solely to cover the cost of the mini's used.

Establishing Handicaps (August 11 – September 22)

Cost: \$1.00 – For 1st three rounds played (Ace Pool) **Does not have to be consecutive weeks**
\$3.00 – Every round after the 1st three (\$1.00 Weekly Payout - \$1.00 Championship - \$1.00 Ace Pool)

Divisions: Pro, Advanced, Intermediate

A player's initial handicap is determined after 3 rounds and will be the average of those 3 rounds minus 54 (par score for Earlewood). If a player throws more than 3 rounds, the best 3 actual scores will be used to determine the final handicap. A 0 handicap will be given to those players throwing less than 3 rounds.

Weekly payouts go to the winner of each division when available.

The ace pool money will be division based. A CTP hole will be designated after the final round for each division that still has ace pool money remaining.

Divisional Championship (September 29)

The top four players in each division (those with the lowest handicap) will compete in the championship. Those not in the championship can come out and watch or participate in the "I Just Want To Throw" event. Cost is \$2.00 per person, two divisions (Pro/Advanced and Intermediate), payouts to 1st and 2nd place in each division. Every player will use their final handicap no matter which event they are in.

Handicap Play (October 6 – October 27)

Cost: \$3.00 (\$2.00 Weekly Payout - \$1.00 Ace Pool)

How often do Intermediate players get a chance to whip up on a Pro or Advanced player? Not often enough right? Well, here's your chance! There will be no divisions and each player will use their final handicap for the entire 4-week period. Payouts to the top 3 finishers each week.

A CTP hole will be designated after the final round for any ace pool money remaining.

It is in a player's best interest to obtain a handicap for Handicap Play as it really levels out the playing field. For example, if an Intermediate player has a final handicap of +8 and a Pro player's handicap is -6, then the intermediate player starts off each round of Handicap Play at 14 strokes ahead of the Pro player!!! Nice huh?
